Highlights of TIHAN's Programs and Services from 2017

We are excited to share that, with your support, TIHAN was able to achieve a number of milestones and accomplishments over the past year:

- We celebrated the third "Living Well with HIV" graduating class.
- We welcomed 10 new presenters to the Living Well with HIV program, furthering TIHAN's community engagement and partnerships.
- We held the first Sharing Well program, allowing individuals living with HIV to develop their personal story that they wish to share with the community.

We served the 25,000th meal at Poz Café.

- We welcomed a new sponsor for Poz Café, St. Frances Cabrini Catholic Church, joining the other 37 sponsoring groups for 2017.
- We served our largest crowd at Poz Café, with 232 individuals present at the December 2017 Poz Café Holiday Dinner Party.
- We served a growing number of individuals living with HIV, reaching 350 people served by the end of 2017.

All of this is possible because of your donations—whether financial, inkind, or volunteer time. Thank you for helping TIHAN make 2017 another record year of supporting people living with HIV to live well!

The Strength to Keep Pushing Forward

Robb had spent years working as an advocate for people living with HIV before he learned that he too was living with the virus. Even with this experience, the diagnosis was difficult to face. He had seen the hardships that friends had to endure (especially the fear and stigma), and now found himself dealing with the same stigmas he had been working so hard to break.

Shortly after Robb's diagnosis in 2003, his partner left him, and life as he knew it began to spiral out of control. Robb had to file for bankruptcy and soon became homeless. There were negative health effects as well, including pneumonia, shingles, and weight loss.

Fortunately, Robb's support system activated. He was connected with an amazing case manager and HIV doctor, who helped him begin to find his way back to "normal" and connected him with resources, including TIHAN.

Robb vividly recalls his first encounter with TIHAN. "My Case Manager was angel sent," he says, "and invited me to Poz Café nearly 14 years ago. When I got there, I recognized many faces from the community. After attending the luncheons a few times, I got up enough nerve to go on my first date [since being diagnosed]!" He refers to that as a big step in his own journey to acceptance.

Over the years, Robb has stayed connected to TIHAN and our programs and services. He still looks forward to the monthly luncheons, and he has always felt supported by volunteers and staff over the years. "TIHAN was able to help me with an electric bill," he recalls. "And you once gave me a gift card for groceries after I was robbed in my own home." Robb's gratitude overflows. "I also appreciate the time and effort that volunteers put into giving us CarePackages and making the weekly check-in calls. I am grateful for all of the help from TIHAN. You have all given me the strength to push on and to reach out to others."

Robb continues to be a strong advocate in the community and believes that there is still a lot of work to be done to decrease (and hopefully eliminate) the stigma around HIV. With the support of TIHAN, his partner, and family members, Robb is determined to continue speaking out and helping others who are dealing with the hardships that can come with living with HIV. Robb, thank you for helping TIHAN to make a positive difference in the lives of those affected by HIV in our community!

The students were attentive and listened and learned about living with HIV today, as our volunteers shared their perspectives of learning to live as well as possible with HIV.

In addition to the vital HIV awareness, prevention, testing, and support messages, speaking engagements like this help empower people living with HIV to share their truths, their experiences, and their strengths.

It takes courage to stand up in front of a few hundred people and be vulnerable while speaking from the heart and answering questions about very personal and sometimes painful experiences. The students were very grateful, and so are we, to have great educators and agents of change!

A Bequest to TIHAN: Dr. Noel Matkin Leaves a Legacy

Recently, we received a \$20,000 bequest from one of the greatest heroes and advocates in TIHAN's history. Noel Matkin, PhD, was a great man, leader, friend, and mentor who passed away in 2016 at age 84. Noel was survived by his partner of almost 25 years, as well as by his daughter, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.

In preparing his will, Noel was careful to make arrangements for his beloved family as well as for the charitable causes closest to his heart.

With Noel's generous bequest, his wish that people living with HIV receive support services will be honored. We were blessed during his life to receive his gifts, and now even after he's gone—Noel will continue to help people in need and make Tucson better.

Arizona Residents: Remember to Claim Your Tax Credit For Your Donation To TIHAN!

TIHAN is certified by Arizona as a Qualifying Charitable Organization, and by donating to

TIHAN, you may be eligible for a tax credit and reduce your state tax liability with a dollar-for-dollar reduction (up to \$400 per person, or \$800 per married couple filing jointly).

Remember that, if you file taxes in the state of Arizona, you can utilize your gift to receive a state tax credit. You are not required to itemize in order to take the tax credit. All you need to do is complete form 321 when you file your Arizona taxes, and list your gift to TIHAN there (our federal tax ID number is 86-0819574). Please contact a tax advisor for more information on this credit.

Thank you for directing some of your tax dollars to support TIHAN and our programs and services!

P.S. You still have time to claim it — the law says you can contribute by April 17, 2018 and still be eligible to take the credit on your 2017 tax return for the state of Arizona.

Reminder About Pets and Service Animals

We love our pets—they are part of our families, and for many of us, a very important part of our support system. However, for safety, hygiene and allergy reasons, we can't have pets at the TIHAN office or at TIHAN events. The only animals permitted in the office and/or at events are service animals.

A service animal is a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability. If you bring your service animal to the TIHAN office or a TIHAN event (such as Poz Café, a volunteer training/event, or a Living Well class), our staff may inquire if the dog is a service animal and ask what task the dog has been trained to perform, per federal guidelines.

TIHAN is committed to ensuring the safety and hygiene of the environment for our CarePartners, service animals, volunteers, and guests. Thank you!
