Our 2022 Program Results

Because of you, we achieved a number of accomplishments over the past year:

You provided support services to 405 individuals living with HIV.

You served 1,994 meals to 247 people living with HIV through our Poz Café lunch program.

You distributed 2,302 CarePackages to 307 people living with HIV.

You helped 365 people living with HIV with a variety of Link support services, connecting people to care and support.

You provided 2,262 grocery store gift cards for food (\$25 each) to address food insecurity to 298 people living with HIV.

You engaged 62 people living with HIV in one or more Living Well, Eating Well, or Planning Well class.

TIHAN staff helped make all this and much more happen, but it was possible only because of your contributions—whether financial, in-kind, or volunteer time. Thank you for helping TIHAN make 2022 another challenging but successful year of building upon our support system that helps people with HIV to live well!

Be Sure to Claim Your Arizona State Tax Credit—There's Still Time

Since TIHAN is a Qualifying Charitable Organization providing assistance to low income Arizonans, your donations to TIHAN qualify you for a state tax reduction. Simply donate by April 18, 2023, and still claim it on your 2022 tax return!

By donating to TIHAN, you can reduce your Arizona state tax liability with a dollar-for-dollar reduction (up to \$400/person, or \$800/married couple filing jointly).

Put your tax credit dollars where your heart is! Invest in TIHAN and our programs and services, and direct some of your state tax dollars to TIHAN.

TIHAN's QCO Code is 20359, which you should include when you file your state tax return and claim your credit.

A Few 2022 TIHAN Highlights

Staff and volunteers provided support services to more than 400 people living with HIV in Southern Arizona

TIHAN's Program Committee developed, distributed, and tallied a CarePartner survey that was completed in April 2022 to assess CarePartner comfort regarding in-person services, as well as levels of food security and depression, and the need for emotional support

Secured funding for food gift cards for the entire year of 2022 and received a gift that will allow us to continue the food gift card program into April 2023

The distribution of our 25,000th CarePackage in December

Grant from Southwest Airlines allowing us to send 50 CarePartners on round-trip flights to anywhere in the country

The large outpouring of gifts and donations for the 2022 holiday support program

Under the leadership of chair Jake Raskob, our Program Committee made recommendations to the Board concerning the criteria to return to in-person services, and supported staff in beginning transitions back to in-person Living Well classes, meetings between CarePartners and Link Specialists, and Poz Café as conditions were deemed safer

Board approval of a SIMPLE IRA retirement plan for staff, as recommended by HR Committee

The hiring of an Operations Manager, Jackson Mileur

The re-starting of in-person Volunteer Orientations and meetings with potential volunteers

Nominating Committee's addition of Rick Franco to the board, under the leadership of chair Denise Nagy

Operating with 75% staffing most of year, and with only 25% of our pre-COVID volunteer numbers

The return of in-person community events where TIHAN could have a presence, including the All Souls Procession, the Pride Parade, Arizona Gay Rodeo Association, the tabling booth at the Pride Festival, Queer for Good Alliance Fund event, SAAF's OUT Brunch, LGBT Chamber of Commerce events, and more

Return to some in-person Board/Committee meetings and TIHAN fundraising, educational, and social events

Completing an independent audit, with the outsider auditor giving a clean "unqualified" opinion, stating that TIHAN's financial condition, position, and operations are fairly presented in the financial statements.

Leslie Kahn's leadership as Board president, with a smooth transition made possible by former President Dan Uroff staying on to support as Vice President, and (almost) the entire board continuing to serve

Human Resources (HR) Committee's advocacy for staff salary/benefits, led by chair Tom Muller

Addition of a new fundraising event (benefit organized by Patricia Ruiz at the Fraternal Order of Eagles)

Under leadership of Dan Uroff and Caroline Lochner, a very successful Treasures for TIHAN, with the highest ever net income, and featuring recording star Billy Gilman (thanks to Jess Losoya)

Investment policy created by Finance Committee, under the leadership of treasurer/chair Arlan Colton

Joint Board and committee chair leadership retreat

4th consecutive year in which income exceeded expenses!

"TIHAN has been a blessing for me and for other people I know. At TIHAN, I found support, true friends, a place to call if I need something. It's like another family that I can lean on if things are going bad, or I need to talk to someone. Thank you for your friendship and all your help. I know it's a lot of work, and a lot of challenges during COVID. I'm very grateful... Thanks to TIHAN, I have a reason to keep going in my life."

"When I really needed you—I had no one and nothing, dumped by everyone—TIHAN was there. And now today too. It's the little things you do that really help us get through. I know it's a lot of work and hard work... but I want you to know how important your help is to me."

"I'm thankful for every bit of help TIHAN has given me. It's one less thing on my plate to think about whether I will have hygiene or cleaning supplies or just an ear to listen. And I'm grateful for the great volunteers and staff who give their time, always with a positive attitude. That reminds me that I am not alone during the times when I don't feel good."

Paper towels, soap, deodorant, shampoo, toothpaste—our CarePackages contain these and many more toiletry items that cannot be purchased with SNAP benefits (formerly known as food stamps). Since most of the people we serve are on limited income, these CarePackages really help people make it through the month.

Remembering Janet Smith

Janet was one of the longest-serving and most iconic volunteers in TIHAN's 28+ years. We first met Janet in 1994. Her son Eric had recently passed away, at age 29, from AIDS-related conditions. The priest at Janet's church, Father Bill Dougherty of St. Cyril's Catholic Parish, had provided pastoral care and support to Janet throughout his illness.



One of the most heartbreaking and galvanizing moments in Janet's life was asking Eric in his final days if he wanted a priest to give him last rites. Eric, who was gay, responded plainly: "They didn't want me. I don't want them."

Those words would forever be with her. She knew his words were his truth, and she understood the pain he felt. It motivated her to action.

It was during her time of mourning his passing and the trauma of him not being accepted by some within her denomination, that an interfaith AIDS group was forming, soon to become TIHAN. When Father Bill received a letter asking his parish to send a representative to an organizing meeting for a new support network to engage compassion ate faith community members, he asked Janet to attend, hoping it would help her, and help the parish better understand and support to people living with HIV.

Janet became one of the founding Board members of TIHAN, and volunteered in a variety of roles with us over the next 25+ years.

She was also one of the founders of TIHAN's Poz Café, a lunch program that Janet held close to her heart, a means of gathering caring people from Tucson-area faith communities to come, learn about HIV, and offer support, a hug, a safe and welcoming space, and a warm meal for people with HIV.

With Janet's guidance and support, Poz Café grew from a handful of attendees gathered around one table, to the largest regular gathering place for people with HIV in Southern Arizona, having served more than 34,000 meals. Janet was passionate about providing a most outstanding experience and meal and treating our guests as the most special people they are. Poz Café would not be a cafeteria style soup kitchen—she made sure it was a dining experience with linens and center pieces. She would carefully instruct the volunteers from sponsoring faith communities each month to fold the napkins just so, reminding them that this Poz Café meal is their version of La Paloma Resort. This is their meal, she would remind them, prepared by us to make everyone feel cared about, worthy of love, and extra special.

Janet Smith is one of the most beloved and consequential leaders in TIHAN's history. Her smile could light up a room, and in fact it did—over and over and over.

As she was present with TIHAN and our CarePartners for all these years, so too were her TIHAN friends present with Janet in her final times, surrounding her with love and care.

Rest in peace and power, Janet, and thank you for your love.
