Our hearts are filled with love as we reflect on the past 30 years, and realize that more love is still needed—especially today. **Thanks for the love you give!**

Be Sure to Claim Your Arizona State Tax Credit—There's Still Time

Since TIHAN is a Qualifying Charitable Organization providing assistance to lowincome Arizonans, your donations to TIHAN qualify you for a state tax credit. Simply donate by April 15, 2024, and still claim it on your 2023 tax return!

By donating to TIHAN, you can reduce your Arizona state tax liability with a dollar-fordollar reduction (up to \$421/person, or \$841/ married couple filing jointly).

Put your tax credit dollars where your heart is! Invest in TIHAN and our programs and services, and direct some of your state tax dollars to TIHAN.

TIHAN's QCO Code is 20359, which you should include when you file your state tax return and claim your credit.



Positive Experiences Pilot Program a Great Success! Thank You, Aunt Rita's Foundation!

Last fall, Aunt Rita's Foundation provided a \$4,000 grant to TIHAN to decrease isolation and increase socialization opportunities for people living with HIV, especially people over the age of 50.

Since the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, social isolation, transportation barriers, and



other health-related concerns increased separation and loneliness. With the reduction in Covid-19 cases in 2023, this pilot program was designed to give people living with HIV the opportunity to attend free social events, and develop support systems with their peers.

As HIV physician Dr. Sudha Nagalingam, Medical Director at El Rio Special Immunology Associates (Southern Arizona's largest HIV medical clinic), shared last year with TIHAN's Board of Directors, research shows that seniors who live alone and are isolated are more likely to experience mental and physical health issues, and there is a gap in providing support services to this population locally.

From September to December, TIHAN quickly planned and carried out Positive Experiences, a pilot program to address the social needs of people living with HIV. 43 CarePartners attended at least one of the four Positive

Experiences social events. The participants were diverse in their backgrounds, and representative of TIHAN's CarePartners.

90% of program participants

were people living with HIV who are seniors (over 50 years of age), and 74% were seniors who live alone.

Through the grant, we were able to offer Lyft rides for people who needed transportation to our social events, and 20 CarePartners accessed rides.

From surveys conducted at the end of the grant period, 92% of participants responded "Strongly Agree" or "Agree" that they are less isolated because of the program, 88% stated they are less lonely because of the program, and 92% said their quality of life has been improved because of their participation in Positive Experiences. Friendships were made, and new connections were formed:

"I've been to all of the Positive Experience events and they each have had something to offer in helping me feel and be more connected to my community (HIV). Thank You!"

"The 1st dinner was very tasty! The 2nd was Zoo, very interesting. The museum was awesome. This movie was as good as I saw with the same theme as a child! I'd love to enjoy more next year as we need the positive interactions together! Thank you so much!"

"All good. All Positive. Good socialization stronger bonds. Enjoy getting together often."

The pilot was a great success, and we are exploring additional improvements. We will be seeking out funding sources to continue the program as it meets key needs among people living with HIV. Thank you, Aunt Rita's Foundation, for providing funds for this pilot program to address critical needs in our local HIV community.

Remembering Tina MacBeth

We give thanks for the life of an amazing TIHAN volunteer who passed away in November. Tina MacBeth was one of our longest-serving and most -loved volunteers.

Over the past 18 years, she served on



CareTeams, helped with our Poz Café lunch and social program, served on our Nominating Committee, volunteered on the Treasures for TIHAN planning teams, helped in the office, and much more. Tina was a major sponsor of many TIHAN events, and a fantastic ambassador and spokesperson. We honored her in 2021 with our Excellence in Caring Award, the highest honor we bestow.

Tina truly did love TIHAN, our programs, our volunteers and donors, and our CarePartners, and she loved us very well...

Tina presented about 20 years younger than her actual age of 82, and people were always amazed when she disclosed her age, especially in light of her active workout and volunteer schedule, as well as her appearance and energy as she participated in book clubs and classes at OLLI, and led events at her retirement community, The Hacienda at the Canyon.

Since the sudden onset of seizures in 2023, Tina was forced to step down from volunteering, and TIHAN's love kicked into high gear. TIHAN volunteers and staff, current and former, were in touch with her through her medical challenges, hoping for her recovery. CarePartners and volunteers at Poz Café signed cards for her which we delivered to her when she was not up for visitors. When it became clear that her time was rapidly approaching, TIHAN friends streamed in to pay our final respects.

As is fitting, Tina had TIHAN friends and volunteers present with her on the morning she took her last breath. Tina is now with the angels, but really she always was one. We give thanks for the love and light that Tina shared so generously with our CarePartners, volunteers, and staff.
