New Beginnings for Poz Café Lunch and Social Program

Poz Café offers healthy meals, socialization opportunities, and a safe place for people living with HIV (our CarePartners) to connect with their peers. Since we started this program, we've served more than 37,000 meals! (The word "poz" is pronounced "paws" and is slang for positive, as in HIV-positive.)

St. Mark's Presbyterian Church graciously provided a home for Poz Café post-pandemic, for which we will be eternally grateful. We're now excited to announce that Poz Café has moved to a new home: Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, on Campbell Avenue, just north of Speedway. We now have a larger and newer space that is located on two major bus lines for our CarePartners who use public transportation, and it's closer to the bus stops for ease of walking in Tucson's extreme weather.

Pastor Amalia Vagts of Our Saviour's welcomed TIHAN and our CarePartners at our first edition of the new Poz Café: "We are excited to have you all here. You are welcome here because of who you are. You are treasured here because of who you are. May your time here today fill you up so much that you can't help but to share with others when you leave here."

We had a packed house of CarePartners join us for the event, all treated to a delicious lunch of lasagna, roasted vegetables, tossed salad, garlic bread, and apple pie. A big thank you to the Culinary Arts Team at Amity Foundation who prepared the meal, and to October's sponsoring groups: Saint Francis in the Foothills United Methodist Church, Congregation M'kor Hayim, Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, and Amity Foundation. Thanks also to the volunteers and donors who made it happen, and our Lead Program Coordinator Gina Snyder, who coordinates it all.

We had a special presentation of thanks to Rick Small and The Stonewall Fund at the Community Foundation for Southern Arizona for their major support of Poz Café. In addition, we had some fun games of bingo, and distribution of CarePackages, and we were very happy to offer an unannounced surprise for our CarePartners in attendance: a \$25 gift card, courtesy of our friends at Walmart Pharmacy! The day also featured 10 nonprofits tabling at our annual Resource Fair designed to make it easier for CarePartners to make connections and access additional services.

It was a full day of fun, friends, food, resources, and community building in our beautiful new space for Poz Café.

Due to health department permit requirements relevant to the spaces we've been using post-pandemic, we have had to use disposable plates and plasticware, and single-use water bottles, which do not provide the full experience we would love to offer.

With our new location, we are working with the church and the Pima County Health Department to make the changes needed to meet the county codes and obtain the necessary permit that will allow us to offer real plates, silverware, and drinking glasses at Poz Café. We know from CarePartners that using disposable items hearkens back to stigmatizing experiences

they've had with family/colleagues who asked them to not eat on their "real dishes" out of fear of transmission of HIV, which is demeaning—and of course factually/scientifically wrong.

We're excited about the wonderful new location for our monthly Poz Cafe lunch and social program, and all the improvements we'll be making in the near future! And we're rolling out new programs soon.

More good things are emerging, and **you** make it happen!

The holidays can be a difficult time. Most of the people whom we serve live on limited disability income, below the poverty level. Many face isolation and depression, especially at this time of year.



This holiday season, can you brighten the day for TIHAN's CarePartners living with HIV? We are collecting donations of <u>new</u>, <u>unused holiday gifts</u> with a value of \$15-\$25.

Gift ideas include practical items such as: toaster ovens, bath towel sets, crock pots, pots and pans, coffeemakers, blankets, pillows. (Remember, most of our CarePartners are age 50+ and live alone.)

Also, TIHAN hopes to provide each of our CarePartners with a \$25 gift card to Target or Walmart so they can buy a holiday gift – perhaps something they need, or a gift for their partner/friend/family member.

The December holiday season is a time when people are seeking to gather and feel a part of a community of people who care, and we are grateful that you make this possible through your support of TIHAN.

Donate Up to \$938 to TIHAN, and Get the Same Amount Back as an Arizona Tax Credit! New 2024 Amounts Announced!

Since TIHAN is a Qualifying Charitable Organization providing assistance to low income residents of Arizona, your donations to TIHAN entitle you to a state tax credit.

By donating to TIHAN, you may be eligible for a tax credit that will reduce your Arizona state tax liability with a dollar-for-dollar reduction (up to \$470/person, or \$938/married couple filing jointly). **Note increased 2024 amounts!** Put your tax credit dollars where your heart is. Invest in people, and in TIHAN's programs and services. The state of Arizona will give you a tax credit for doing so!

Give local, keep local, and direct some of your state tax dollars to TIHAN.

Our QCO code is 20359, which you should include when you file your taxes and claim your credit. Please contact your tax advisor for more info. Thanks for giving to TIHAN, and making a difference in the lives of so many people living with HIV.

HIV to live well. They have exemplified philanthropy by being major annual donors to TIHAN, with a strong commitment to supporting TIHAN's support services and advocacy. Lindi and her beloved husband Frank, before his untimely passing earlier this year, have been strong advocates for HIV awareness and support for people living with HIV, having experienced the struggles and strength of their daughter Lacey, a healthcare worker who contracted HIV after suffering a needle-stick and died in 2002 from AIDS-related complications at the age of 32. Lindi and Frank's support continues as Lindi carries on their legacy

of love and honor for Lacey and others impacted by HIV. For 25 years, Lindi and Frank have shown their love for the people and programs of TIHAN, and their gifts from the heart support hundreds of people in our community living with HIV.

The Spirit of Philanthropy Award recognizes people for their generous spirit, evidenced in their contributions of time, efforts, and/or resources. These people demonstrate extraordinary leadership and vision in support of charitable agencies' goals. Their contribution makes a better community a reality. Make an Impact <u>AND</u> You'll Also Benefit from an IRA Required Minimum Distribution Gift

If you are age 73 or older and have a traditional Individual Retirement Account (IRA), you can save on taxes and make a charitable rollover gift from your IRA. With a direct transfer from your traditional IRA to a qualified charity such as TIHAN, you satisfy your minimum required distribution for the year. IRA Charitable Rollover transfers are free of income tax.

TIHAN is a qualified 501(c)(3) charity, and our nonprofit tax ID number is 86-0819574.

If you'd like to make a contribution from your IRA to TIHAN, please contact your IRA plan administrator to send the contribution directly to TIHAN. To not count as taxable income to you, a charitable gift from your IRA must be issued in the charity's name and sent directly to us by your IRA plan administrator.
